## Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais Student Selected as Winner of Multilingual Essay Contest

ELS Educational Services, Inc., is pleased to announce that, from a pool of over 2,000 entrants, Bárbara Rafaela da Silva Machado, a Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais student, was one of 60 students from 27 countries and representing 57 universities to be selected as a winner of the 2017 Many Languages, One World® international essay contest.

Machado attended the Many Languages, One World Global Youth Forum and Northeastern University Global Youth Symposium in Boston, Massachusetts. Machado was provided with an all-expense-paid trip to Boston and New York City and the opportunity to speak at the General Assembly of the United Nations. On 21 July, 2017, Machado and the other winners presented action plans related to the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The Many Languages, One World contest challenged students around the globe to write their essays in one of the six official languages of the United Nations, that is neither the contestants' first language (language(s) spoken at home) nor the medium of instruction in either their primary or secondary education, or a medium of instruction if attending a bilingual school. Entrants were asked to write an essay that reflected their personal, academic, cultural and national context and discussed global citizenship and cultural understanding and the role that multilingual ability can play in fostering these. The official languages of the United Nations are Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, and Spanish.

Machado studies Mechanical Engineering at Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais. For the contest, Machado wrote her essay in English.

In 2017, more than 6,000 students and sponsors from 170 countries participated in the initial phase of this contest. Students who participated are pursuing undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral degrees.
