UFmg goes global

### **QS World University Ranking**

According to the latest QS World University Rankings: Latin America and The Caribbean 2025, UFMG outperformed 97% of institutions in the region. The ranking was assessed at 437 universities from 23 countries, confirming the university's consistent upward trajectory. UFMG ranked 17th in 2020, 15th in 2021, 16th in both 2022 and 2023, and reached 14th place in 2024. According to Professor Dawisson Belém Lopes, responsible for UFMG's Office for Institutional Data, this ranking is one of the most traditional—published annually since 2004—and applies a highly selective cutoff criterion. "To be included on this list, an institution must have at least 1,000 articles published in the Scopus database over the past five years. Being part of it is already an achievement," remarked the director. UFMG performed above its overall ranking in the 2025 edition in the fields of Law (201–250), Education (251–300), Arts and Humanities (301–400), and Life Sciences (501–600). Dawisson adds that in the fields of Sports Sciences, Architecture, and Veterinary Medicine, the University ranks among the top 25% of institutions worldwide. In her statement, UFMG's president expressed gratitude to the entire university community for their contributions to this achievement and their unwavering commitment to public education, research, and outreach of excellence at UFMG.



### Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais wins award on Science and Technology

Researchers from UFMG secured first place in two of the five categories at the 17th Mercosul Science and Technology Award, which focused on the theme "Nanotechnology Applied to Health." Professor Frederic Jean Georges Frezard, from the Department of Physiology and Biophysics, won in the Senior Researcher category for his work "Application of Nanotechnology in the Treatment of Neglected and Emerging Infectious Diseases." Pedro Henrique Dias Moura Prazeres, from the Graduate Program in Pathology, won in the Young Researcher category for his study "Ionizable Lipid Nanoparticle Platform for Cancer Immunotherapy." These achievements highlight UFMG's commitment to academic excellence and service to society. The Ministry of Science, Technology, and Innovation (MCTI) and the National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq) announced the award. It is an initiative of the Specialized Meeting on Science and Technology of Mercosur (RECyT) and member countries' science and technology agencies.



# UFMG is recognized as a reference in the International Sports Scenario

The pair of gymnasts, Tamires Rebeca Santos and Lucas Barbosa won the bronze medal at the latest Aerobic Gymnastics World Championship. Associated with UFMG's Aerobic Sports Gymnastics Project, the duo is also the current mixed pairs champion from the 2022 World Games, held in the United States. These achievements represent an essential part of our academic commitment. According to Professor Sandra Goulart de Almeida, proof of this is the establishment of the Sports and Leisure Commission, which works to develop a sports policy for the University. Professor Sandra was invited to the President's Forum, where she discussed the experience of being called upon to provide swift, efficient, and sustainable responses to pressing issues of equity, equality, and access. It explored ways to restore public trust in academic and scientific contributions from higher education institutions. The forum was moderated by Professor Patrick Deane, Vice-Chancellor of Queen's University Canada.

In professor's Sandra's words "this milestone challenges us to broaden our partnerships while remaining true to the ideals that inspired us at the Group's founding in 2000: fostering opportunities for the shared Iberian history that connects our countries to thrive through partnerships among Brazilian, Portuguese, and Spanish institutions. Despite our differences, we are united by common values—above all, the belief in higher education and science as instruments for building more just, equitable, and respectful societies". The group comprises sixty universities and has nine Doctoral Associations covering distinct fields of knowledge. These groups conduct research, promote seminars and publish together ensuring the cooperation between our institutions.
