

Guidance for situations of risk

Federal University of Minas Gerais Office of Foreign Affairs - DRI

This document aims to provide guidance that can guide you in times of risk or more complex challenges involving your safety and well-being. We confirm the University's support for combating all forms of violence, as well as supporting the victims. We emphasize the University's commitment to combating all forms of violence and are available to assist you.

Here you will find information on who and how to turn to in case of psychological and emotional difficulties, *bullying* and violence, racism and racial injury, sexual harassment and harassment, LGBTphobia, gender-based violence and domestic violence, and accidents or theft.

1. Mental health

1.4) In case of suicidal ideation or acute crisis, call the *Centro de Valorização da Vida* (CVV) at phone number 188 and you will speak to a competent professional to help you.

2. Bullying and Cyberbullying



2.1) Article 146-A of the Brazilian Penal Code criminalizes practices of *bullying* and *cyberbullying*, therefore, it is possible to contact the *Policia Militar (PM)* to file a police report. The procedure can be done virtually through the website: https://delegaciavirtual.sids.mg.gov.br/sxgn/, or in person at any police station.

3. Racism and Racial Injury

- 3.1) The <u>Law No. 7,716 of January 5, 1989</u> changed by Law No. 14,532, of January 11, 2023, establishes racism and racial injury as non-bailable crimes in Brazil. Therefore, it is possible to file a police report. The procedure can be completed online through the website: https://delegaciavirtual.sids.mg.gov.br/sxgn/, or in person at any police station.
- 3.2) You can search for Black Coexistence Center (CCN) at the Faculty of Philosophy and Human Sciences (FAFICH), on the first floor, room 1058, in order to receive moral support from the community. You can also contact the Academic Directory (DA) of your unit or the Central Student Directory (DCE/UFMG).

4. Homophobia and Transphobia



- 4.1) Through th e<u>Direct Action of Unconstitutionality by Omission (ADO) 26</u>, of June 13, 2019, the Supreme Federal Court (Brazil's supreme court) equated acts of homophobia and transphobia with the crimes of racism and racial injury mentioned above. Thus, it is possible to file a Police Report (BO) with the *Policia Militar* (PM), in person or through the website: https://delegaciavirtual.sids.mg.gov.br/sxgn/, alleging racism and/or racial injury for homophobic or transphobic attitudes.
- 4.2) If you are afraid or concerned about reporting through regular channels, you can contact a specialized police station:

5. Gender-Based Violence and Domestic Violence

5.1) A LEI Nº 11.340, DE 7 DE AGOSTO DE 2006, also known as Maria da Penha Law, Criminalizes gender-based violence, especially domestic violence, and provides legal instruments to support victims and hold perpetrators accountable. It is worth noting that the law does not exclude trans women and therefore also protects them. It's worth saying that the law also protects trans people.



To ask for help or make a complaint, look for a police station, preferably the police station specialized in helping women, telephone: 180. By reporting the incident, you can file a police report (BO) and request a protective measure.

6. Theft, Robbery, Assault, Bodily Injury and others

Look for the nearest police station to file a police report (BO) or do so through the virtual police station website: https://delegaciavirtual.sids.mg.gov.br/sxgn/.

In case of injury or shock, go to the nearest UPA (Emergency Care Unit) and, if necessary, call an ambulance on: 192. You can also call the fire department on: 193.

7. Accidents
